|Transport Minister visits HS2 route

Transport Minister, Simon Burns visited the planned route of HS2 through Broxtowe this week.

I took Simon to Toton Sidings, Nuthall, Strelley Village and to Trowell.

I will post a more detailed report on the web site. But in short he saw where the route will run and how it will impact on a number of homes. Simon also made it plain there will be a full consultation with residents before the route is finalised.



I was keen to show Simon Toton Sidings so he appreciated why the land enjoyed by residents is so precious and also to discuss the huge potential the planned East Midlands hub will bring to the area. Simon spent time in Strelley Village and at Nottingham Road in Nuthall where the line will run parallel to the M1.



Green Belt give away begins

Broxtowe Borough Council has now agreed the final stages of its plans for future development in the constituency. The "Core Strategy" document will be examined by the Planning Inspector at a public inquiry.

Conservative Councillors were the only ones to vote against the plan as it accepts a housing target of 6,150 houses and with only enough brown field land for 3-3,500 the rest will be built on our Green Belt. The plan also puts forward Green Belt land for development before brown field sites.

The ruling Labour / Lib Dem group are acting in the name of "localism" and so I fear it will be very difficult for the Government to intervene.

As a consequence of the refusal of Broxtowe's ruling group to stand up for the people they are meant to represent, developers continue to draw up and submit plans for thousands of houses on our Green Belt land.

Woodhouse Way - public meeting

The outline application for Woodhouse Way has been amended; the plans are now for 555 houses instead of 734, despite plans to build HS2 through the land. The consultation deadline is 29th May and you can have your say by clicking <a href="https://example.com/here-plans-now-new-page-plans-now-pla

There is a public meeting to oppose these plans at Mornington Primary School, on **Saturday 15th June, 3 pm-4 pm**. We will also be discussing the planning application on City Council land and plans to build approximately 300 houses there.

EU move to protect bees

I have sent a special bee mail newsletter to the many people who have contacted me about the declining bee population. As a strong supporter of the honey bee and bumble bee I know how important bees are, accounting for 80% of insect plant pollination.

The EU has announced that from December there will be a two year ban on three pesticides believed to be particularly harmful to bees The insecticides - imidacloprid, clothianidin, and thiamethoxam are used to treat seeds, are applied to the soil or sprayed on plants and cereals attractive to bees.

The banning of neonicotinoids is controversial because the experts do not agree on the evidence or the science this is why the EU has decided on a two year ban.



Bid to save the New White Bull

The New White Bull Pub in Giltbrook is faced with being sold off by Greene King. With currently over 160 signatures on the petition to stop the loss of this much loved community pub, I have written to Greene King asking them to reconsider their decision given the strength of feeling locally. I will keep you posted.



Have your say on the future of Kimberley Brewery Site

There will be a public meeting on the updated plans to develop the Kimberley Brewery Site this Friday May 31st at Holy Trinity Church Hall, Kimberley, between 2 and 7pm.

Metis Developments, will be there to answer inquiries and to gather opinion. I am told the developers are keen for public involvement in the plans and that feedback forms will be available for resident's comments.
