#### Hardship scheme success - but Notts must match the City on helping all businesses affected by the tram works

Notts County Council has agreed to add £25,000 to the exceptional hardship scheme to help struggling businesses in Beeston affected by the tram works. This matches £25,000 from the City Council and will be hugely welcomed. But, Notts County Council has yet to agree with the City and extend the current scheme to all qualifying businesses and traders.

I have been calling for the scheme to be extended; yet another business has contacted me this week to say they are on the brink of going under unless they get help. Like others they can prove their substantial cut in profits is due to the tram works.

Meanwhile BT has denied claims they are to blame for the tram works being behind schedule. I spoke to BT yesterday and they have agreed to make further enquiry given I have been told in no uncertain terms that BT are holding up the works on Chilwell/High Road.

I will let you know the outcome and continue to press for everyone to work together and get this project back on schedule!

Broxtowe Borough Council has published its plans to allow hundreds of houses on Toton's Green Belt. I am meeting South Broxtowe 2020 (the community group campaigning in favour of HS2 and world class economic development at Toton Sidings) next week. Shakeela Ahmed came to my regular Friday surgery to discuss the terrible disease that has afflicted all three of her children. Lafora is a very rare and fatal condition that has killed her eldest daughter at 18, and now affects her son who is almost 18 and her youngest daughter. It is difficult to imagine the unbearable grief of losing one child but to know you will lose all your children is truly terrible.

There is no cure for Lafora and Shakeela, who lives in Beeston is campaigning for more support for research being conducted in Canada. I have given her my support and accordingly have contacted the Department of Health.
