Hello again,

This was Chilwell Road in Beeston at this morning. With just a few days notice residents were told that from today and for the next five Sundays the tram works will be all day every day right outside their homes. There is no respite despite an assurance from the leader of the Borough Council that no such agreement had been made. Well it has and it is intolerable.



The long suffering patience of good decent folk in Beeston and Chilwell is gone - there is now genuine anger and people have simply had enough. We are fed up with the broken promises - we have been trying to live and work in the tramworks for well over a year.



From Lower, Fletcher and Albert Road I received very serious complaints yesterday that access was impossible for emergency vehicles. I immediately contacted the police who visited the area. NET's response was to take a look sometime next week.

Despite the promises, the Borough Council now plans to close Beeston bus station. It's the stuff of madness making a mockery of the quite proper principle that connectivity is the key to great public transport.

Shops and businesses have reached the brink of financial ruin; In Beeston Square businesses have the double whammy of the tram works and development works. We are in real danger of losing some of our best shops.

Meanwhile the County Council remains determined not to add to the existing pot of money and continues to deny

traders compensation. My thanks to everyone who has signed my petition - over 3,000 signatures in just a few weeks calling for compensation for all small businesses affected by the tram works. I presented it to Councillors Jackson, Carr and Doddy yesterday morning who in turn will present it at Thursday's County Council meeting.

I am pleased City Council leader Jon Collins is able to meet next Friday to discuss all these matters. The leader of Notts County Council has also agreed to meet on the same day. Milan Radulovic has also agreed to meet residents wanting a 3m fence to restore their privacy and security.

So I am making progress - but on Thursday Notts County Council can really make a difference and support motions from Cllrs Steve Carr, Richard Jackson and John Doddy and do the right thing by our residents and businesses. It's good to see the Conservatives and Lib Dems working together for their community and a real shame Labour just can't bring themselves to work with us.

### **Kimberley Tram plans**

Meanwhile Kimberley's Labour Borough Councillors are looking for sponsorship to create their own plans for a tram line out to the Ikea Retail Park and beyond! I think trams make for good public transport but only when they are properly planned and constructed. I wouldn't wish what has happened in Beeston and Chilwell on any other part of the constituency.
