HS2 says Toton is almost out but we're not down!

As I forecast some weeks ago, today's report from HS2 has said Toton is no longer the site of choice for the East Midlands hub.

The Transport Secretary, Patrick McLoughlin has made it clear to me that Toton is still a possibility but alternative sites are now being actively explored.

It goes without saying that I am disappointed as I believe the Hub should be at Toton; it will be a once in a generation opportunity for jobs and better transport connectivity for all of us in Broxtowe.

However, an alternative route to the west of Broxtowe may mean we would avoid the HS2 line completely - which is good news for Strelley Village and parts of Trowell, Nuthall and Stapleford.



As you know, along with Conservative Councillors and the campaign group SB2020, I have warned that Broxtowe's plans for a minimum of 500 houses at Toton and a second class economic development plan was in danger of scuppering our chances of securing the East Midlands Hub. I was derided by Labour and some Lib Dems. Broxtowe Borough Council's plans certainly have not helped and it concerns me greatly that they and the City Council are proving not to be able to deliver HS2 at Toton. It is also very important to remember Broxtowe's plans to allow at least 500 houses on Toton's Green Belt wherever the Hub is sited!

I am meeting the Chairman of HS2, Sir David Higgins to discuss his report, on Thursday. I will continue to make the case for Toton but I want to know the implication, if the route changes, on places like Strelley Village, Nuthall and Trowell. I have also requested an urgent meeting with the leaders of

Broxtowe Borough, Nottingham City and Nottinghamshire County Councils.

It is important to note that wherever the East Midlands hub is sited there will be huge economic benefit within a large radius. I would ask you to read today's report from Sir David - and as ever I am keen to know your views.

Attenborough Station survey

East Midlands Trains have shared their survey of passengers using Attenborough station, where bad and inconsiderate commuter parking has been a real problem.

EMT say "We identified that 80% of Attenborough customers come from postcodes we would more expect to use Beeston Station. 15% of Attenborough customers would be expected to use Long Eaton and 5% Local Areas to Attenborough."

It seems that traffic chaos caused by the tram works isn't helping but that will ease. It is thought that more parking at both Beeston and Long Eaton stations would make a difference. I will accordingly hold another meeting with all relevant parties. We do not want to jeopardise the future of Attenborough in any way but we do need to find a solution to the parking problem. I will keep you updated.

Oxylane - Borough Council backs controversial development

Broxtowe Borough Council's cabinet has voted to join with developers Oxylane to apply for planning permission for a giant leisure and retail site on Green Belt land near Kimberley. Two previous applications for the same site were narrowly turned down by Broxtowe's planning committee. This new threat to Broxtowe's Green Belt comes just weeks after the Council voted through its plans to build over 6,000 houses in the borough with the majority on the Green Belt.

Broxtowe will now submit a joint planning application for the site; there will be another public consultation and a decision is expected early in the New Year. I will of course keep you updated.


Tram work shambles

I well remember in July being told the roads would all be open on September 15. Now we are told it will be the end of November.

On Friday, the Chancellor, George Osborne on a visit to Beeston told the Nottingham Post that the City Council's management of the project had been "incompetent"; he was right.

I am still waiting for a reply from the constructors, TWA, as to why High/Chilwell Road is still not open and why businesses and residents were not properly informed. Severn Trent water are adamant they are not to blame and indeed the works outside my office are now being done by TWA.
