Transport Secretary visits tram works

Hello again,

Patrick McLoughlin visited Beeston this morning to see for himself the effect of the tram works on residents and businesses. I took Patrick, who had arrived at Beeston Station, to meet Allison Dobbs who chairs the Lower and Fletcher Road Residents Association.

Alison didn't hold back in telling Patrick what life had been like for almost two years. Poor communication and information was a particular complaint - along with living in the middle of a major construction project.

Alison handed over a detailed letter with a set of photographs. In an interview with BBC East Midlands Today Patrick McLoughlin said Nottingham City Council should consider compensating residents given everything they had suffered.







We then made our way to Chilwell/High Road for a walkabout and a meeting with Julie Cameron from Cameron House. Julie told Patrick that she was pro tram but that the change of plans for Chilwell/High Road, which means it has been closed for well over a year to traffic, have nearly destroyed her business. Julie is optimistic the tram will bring new shoppers to the area but like me, fears the 18 month road closure may mean long standing customers will not return.



We explained the compensation package was limited and how hard I had to fight for extra help for shops and traders on Chilwell/High Road. I also gave details of the long struggle I had with the City and County Councils, to get the compensation scheme extended to all small businesses who had suffered a drop in trade. Julie also handed over a letter detailing her experience and that of other traders.

It was a short visit but I am confident that the views of residents and businesses have been well expressed by Alison and Julie. Patrick clearly understood the level of disruption and the adverse affect on residents and businesses. He said we need to learn lessons - especially about how to make sure these sorts of projects are properly managed and planned from the outset. Poor communication and information has been a real "theme" and Patrick expressed his concern that people had been badly let down. We are now assured High/Chilwell Road will be open for this week's Oxjam festival (details below). Looking at the works this morning it's going to be a tough call.

Finally, given Patrick arrived and left from Beeston Station, I used the opportunity to lobby him for better access to both platforms and general modernisation.
