We won and my colleagues on the County Council went further spending hundreds of thousands on improving Middle Street.

Labour now control the County Council and plan to close Middle Street. The arguments against closure are arguably even stronger now, but sadly I have heard no complaint from those so vociferous when the Conservatives planned the same. I refuse to be cynical and conclude party politics were and are at play. Instead I am contacting the Trustees at Middle Street to see if there is any support to save it.
