Broxtowe is doing great business!

The Business Minister, Matt Hancock visited two great Broxtowe businesses this week. Matt announced £3 million of funding for a project involving SMS in Beeston. The firm which is going from strength to strength is working with partners to develop a better way of sterilising medical equipment used in hospitals.

Matt then went to Cemex in Attenborough.

Whatever your political persuasions there's little debate about how the economy is recovering, with record levels of employment, growing order books and wages outstripping inflation - both locally and nationally. I am of the view this is due to the Government's economic policies and some of the tough decisions we have had to take.

Toton Village Green hearing - statements needed by Tuesday March 10

The enquiry into whether the land at Toton Sidings should have Village Green status will begin on April 13. Anyone who wants to take part must provide a short written statement by this Tuesday, March 10. Gaining Village Green status was something I suggested as it would protect the land from development - far more than being designated Green Belt land.

It has been a very long process and will only stand any chance of success if people are prepared to come forward and detail how they have used the land. Members of TEPS will have received a useful email which I would urge TEPS members to follow.

If anyone else wants to take part please contact me as a matter of some urgency. Having come this far it would be hugely disappointing if this opportunity was lost through want of support.

Backing Beeston - backing the BID

Beeston is the only one of our three towns to have a BID. In short, local businesses voted to set up the scheme which takes an annual fee and in return provides professional support to promote the town. I have supported the BID in the past but in the last year or so have been contacted by a number of member businesses who don't believe the BID is value for money, lacks drive and is not independent from Broxtowe Borough Council.

I met key members of the BID and we had a very frank discussion. As a result I came to the conclusion that there is a real desire for the organisation to be a strong independent voice for businesses in Beeston. There is a recognition the BID must be seen as good value before the autumn vote on whether to renew the scheme. The people I met had the requisite determination and enthusiasm. I am more than happy to work with the BID and have undertaken to assist with a number of projects to restore Beeston so it is able to take full advantage of the tram, when it finally arrives! Details when they have been finalised.



Tramwork delays continue and more cyclists injured

Parts of Fletcher Road have seen considerable work sparking a number of rumours. The promise that the work would soon be finished has been broken. Meanwhile, I have received yet more complaints from cyclists badly injured after getting caught in the tram tracks. I have contacted Tramlink/NET again as there is clearly a serious problem which they must address as they are under a duty to make sure the tram tracks are safe.

Kimberley and Stapleford Ministerial call

FAs promised, the Towns Minister, Penny Mordaunt is holding a conference call with Broxtowe Borough Council's towns team to discuss traders concerns which were raised on her recent visit. I will report back with any news.

Canalside Heritage Centre is good to go!

Culture Minister Ed Vaizey paid Beeston a visit to see the work of the Canalside Heritage trust who are all set to start a remarkable project at cottages by the weir.

Full credit goes to Stuart Craven and his team who, against all odds, have won Heritage Lottery funding and the support of the Canals and River Trust, to restore the cottages and build a visitor centre with gardens.

The project is a real community effort and will take two years to complete. It's been a pleasure to back it all the way and play a small part in securing funding.

It is good to see Notts County Council is spending the extra £2.7 million of Government funding they received specifically to repair pot holes in the County. I am continuing to ensure we get our fair share! Bizarrely, Attenborough's Labour County Councillor had claimed "savage cuts" were preventing pot hole repairs.



Party political comment

The General Election is eight weeks away and the campaigning has begun. In Broxtowe the Lib Dems will not be selecting their candidate until the end of March which is holding up arrangements for hustings!

In the meantime a number of constituents have commented on how the Labour candidate and former MP has experienced a remarkable change in political direction after years of being a moderate Labour MP.
