Minister backs M1 access from open cast mine

Transport Minister, John Hayes paid a visit to Trowell Services to see the proposed direct access to the planned open cast coal mine between Trowell and Cossall.

We were joined by local Councillors Philip Owen and Lydia Ball. We continue to oppose the open cast which has been approved by Notts County Council, but argue that direct access would at least prevent up to 12 HGV movements across Trowell Moor and up to Nuthall roundabout.

Tram testing underway



The tram has finally arrived and the testing is set to continue for a number of months. Chilwell/ High Road is beginning to look really good and when all the work is finished and a number of buildings restored, it will be extremely attractive. My concern is that the approach to the centre of Beeston is far from good as the view is largely the rear of the Square. It is to be hoped Beeston will benefit from some new Councillors with the requisite imagination and vision - and the will to work with everyone.

Bus routes under threat as tram approaches

I have been contacted by a number of constituents very concerned about the future of two buses. The 18 Trent Barton bus and the Y36 "Your Bus". It seems both routes are under threat when the tram starts running. Trent Barton have issued a statement on their website which you can read [here](#). Trent Barton say no final decision has been made and as you might imagine I have written to them urging them not to cut the route, especially given so many Rylands residents want to keep a direct bus into Nottingham. I wrote to Your Bus who do not consider the current route to be viable. I have now written to the County Council and asked them to intervene to save the service.

Bramcote Island and A52 works

The Highways Agency have replied to my letter to say that they will not build a fence to screen houses on Valmont and Russley Roads from the A52 but will plant some shrubs. I am far from convinced and will continue to campaign for the fence; I have also asked them (again) to finish the rather shoddy job of replanting Bramcote Island.

Rylands development update

Broxtowe Borough Council have received amended plans from the developers of the Beeston Business Park development in the Rylands. The plans increase housing numbers from 285 to 310 which will apparently make the scheme more financially viable. I have already secured support from the LEP to "encourage" Broxtowe Borough Council to finalise this scheme or we run the risk of losing £900,000 of sports funding.
