Cemex visit



It was pouring with rain when I visited Cemex in Attenborough on Friday morning, but I still enjoyed the tour of the site! Cemex is experiencing very high demand for its gravel products, though the current workings will be exhausted in 2015/16.

The company's legacy at Attenborough will be the fabulous Nature Reserve where wildlife flourishes as barges move along the waters, taking gravel to the Attenborough processing plant.

Record employment and wage increases outpacing inflation for the first time in five years.

This week's good economic news has been widely welcomed. After a number of difficult years for many people as we have rebuilt our economy, we are now beginning to see the very real positive results. We now have record levels of employment; in Broxtowe the number of people looking for work has halved since April 2010. I am particularly pleased that the number of under 24's out of work has halved from 560 in April 2010 to 280 last month.

Nationally, there are half a million more people in full time work and a record number of women with a job. Last month's figure indicate there are 687,000 job vacancies nationally.

Statistics can sound very cold until you remember that this is all about real people, in work, earning a wage and supporting themselves and their family.

The news that wages have at last risen faster than inflation shows that we are making a real difference to people's lives, delivering a better economic future not just for ourselves but also for our children and grandchildren.

Tram shambles; June opening set back but some good news for struggling shops and businesses

Nottingham City Council has agreed to top up the Hardship Fund for businesses and shops on Chilwell/High Road. The news is particularly welcome given the road will not be open to through traffic until December 21st. This is because of the difficulties on the Middle Street/Station Rd Junction. However the shops and cafes are open for business so please pay them a visit!



Given the apparent need for 6 months of test runs there is now a very real chance the tram will not be open until June 2015. It is very much to be hoped that the tram will be operating before then.

I attended a Chilwell Road Traders liaison meeting; unfortunately the representatives of the constructors (TWA) were not able to answer a number of important questions from traders. However, I have received a number of answers to a large variety of questions, complaints and concerns; at the moment I have one member of my team who is spending almost all his time dealing with tram matters, because there are so many problems and enquiries. There is a lot to report back on so I will send out my special tram email newsletter early next week. Please let me know if you would like a copy.

Residents parking knock back

Meanwhile residents in Beeston and Chilwell, notably in the Dovecote Lane and Cator Lane North areas, will be very disappointed that efforts to secure residents parking schemes have been stalled. Notts County Council has decided to review the affect of the tram on commuter parking on residential streets, a year after the line opens. It takes six months to get up a scheme so despite all their efforts it will two years before any new scheme is introduced! Residents can be assured of my support though unfortunately this is a decision for the County Council.

Saving Kingsbridge Way and Middle Street Resource centre

Nottinghamshire County Council will decide the fate of two important local services on Thursday. The Labour controlled Council plans to close the Kingsbridge Way short break facility in Chilwell and there are doubts over the future of the Middle Street Resource Centre in Beeston. Conservative Councillors have tabled a motion that will allow both to remain open and I hope all our County Councillors will vote for it.

Hope for Toton's Green Belt?

Broxtowe Borough Council's Hs2 working group has voted against any development on Toton's Green belt if the Hs2 East Mids hub doesn't come to Toton Sidings. This decision, which was opposed by Labour Councillors and on which the Lib Dem Councillor abstained, now goes to Broxtowe's Cabinet. We will see if Broxtowe's leader, Milan Radulovic stays true to his statement that "If Hs2 doesn't come we will be opposing the 500 homes. If it doesn't go ahead nothing will go ahead" .
